# Layered Mitigation Strategies



Reducing SARS-CoV-2 transmission in schools is a shared responsibility. Schools can limit transmission by layering the following effective prevention strategies:

- Promoting COVID-19 vaccination for those eligible
- Consistent and correct use of masks
- Physical distancing
- Screening testing and symptomatic testing
- Improving ventilation
- Handwashing and respiratory etiquette
- Staying home when sick and getting tested
- Testing and contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine
- Routine cleaning with disinfection under certain conditions.

# COVID-19 Testing



- Weekly screening with SHIELD
  - Available to all unvaccinated students
  - Completed weekly in school starting the week of September 13
- Daily Drive Up - Wisconsin Diagnostic
  - 8:00am-8:30am at Green Bay
- Binax Now
  - Available to all symptomatic students and staff as needed
  - Test to Stay - close contacts from within school
    - Testing on days 1, 3, 5, & 7
- Alliant Health
  - Testing unvaccinated weekly

# Vaccinations



**All but 19 employees vaccinated as of 9/17/2021 (97%)**

**Middle School Vaccination Information as of 9/17/2021**

794 students in grades 7 and 8 eligible for vaccination

78.71% fully vaccinated

**80.50% fully or partially vaccinated**

19.50% eligible 7th & 8th grade unvaccinated



# Close Contact & Quarantine



- **Close Contact for students** - For K-12 school settings, indoors, unvaccinated individuals who are less than 3' of a positive individual for more than 15 cumulative minutes in a 24-hour period, regardless of masking. [CDC Close Contact Link](#)
- **Close Contact** for lunch due to unmasking is 6 feet (*this is why we are in the process of making lunch 6ft distanced starting today and no later than 9/7*)

# Close Contact & Quarantine



- **Close Contact Quarantine for unvaccinated** - Individuals determined to be a close contact *could be required* to quarantine for 7 to 14 days (determined in collaboration with the LCHD)
  - **Test to Stay Option for Unvaccinated** - Test on days 1, 3, 5, & 7 (dependent upon the Lake County Health Department)
  - **Test to Stay Option for Vaccinated** - Test between days 3 & 5

Specific rules subject to change per Lake County Department of Public Health

# NEW Proximity Live Quarantine Instruction



- K-8 quarantining students will receive one hour of ELA and one hour of math instruction daily
  - K-5 students will receive instruction at their grade level
  - 6-8 students will receive instruction in their assigned pathway
- Proximity will use D112 curricular resources and follow D112 pacing guides
- Once the district is notified of a quarantining student, the student will be assigned to a Proximity class by the following school day
  - Students are assigned a time to attend the two classes
- Proximity Live Quarantine instruction started this week
  - Students will be assigned work by their classroom teacher (homeroom, content, creative arts, music, librarian, and physical education teachers) to meet the 2 ½ to 3 hours of asynchronous instruction
- Once a student is cleared to return to school, the student will return to his/her in-person assigned classroom teacher/teachers

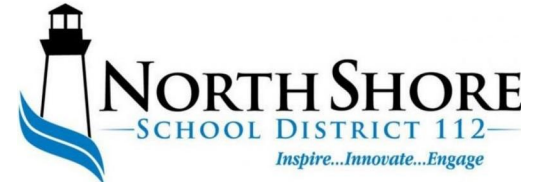
# What are our Next Steps?
