## North Shore School District 112 ARP ESSER Spending Plan

#### Introduction:

The purpose of the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) grant is to help school districts safely reopen and maintain safe operation of schools and address the impact of Covid-19 on students by addressing academic, social, emotional, and health needs. North Shore School District 112 has been awarded \$2,946,136 in ARP ESSER funds. This plan describes how the funds will be used.

### **Prevention and Mitigation Strategies:**

As part of our reopening plan, the District will be using funds to support all of the mitigations currently in place, such as social distancing, voluntary testing, enhanced cleaning and disinfection, hygiene, and ventilation. Masks are available in all of our schools should students need any.

#### **Reducing the Impact of Lost Instructional Time:**

The District will hire 7 math interventionists and will pay for an online tutoring platform to help students recover from lost instructional time due to COVID-19.

# Responding to the Social, Emotional, Mental Health, and Academic Needs of All Students:

District 112 will spend approximately \$50,000 per year for the next 3 years to procure student data analytics to be used to help respond to the various needs of students.
